This Board heads the Corporation that acts as the legal body for the Diocese under the laws of the State of Iowa. The directors are trustees of all diocesan properties and monies. They also are responsible for the Iowa Diocesan Foundation Fund, which is a flexible and convenient investment fund for congregations as

well as diocesan endowments and bequests. The directors necessarily are involved in the areas of property and securities. The Directors also assist the Bishop in setting mission and ministry priorities, and assessing the work of its various Commissions.

Individual Responsibilities of Members of the Board of Directors:

- 1. Attend all board meetings and functions, including the annual orientation event.
- 2. Be informed about the Diocesan plan, mission, services, policies, and programs.
- 3. Review agenda and supporting materials prior to board and committee meetings.
- 4. Serve as liaison to committees and commissions as requested by the Bishop and offer to take on special assignments.
- 5. Be willing to ask questions, take responsibility and follow through on assignments.
- 6. Keep up to date on developments in the local, state, the broader church, and in the Anglican Communion.
- 7. Assist the Board in carrying out its fiduciary responsibilities, such as reviewing the periodic financial statements and the annual audits.
- 8. Attend Chapter meetings and assist in unifying chapters and the diocese.
- 9. Chapter Representatives are expected to:
 - Represent to the Board the needs and concerns of the chapter congregations.
 - Be a liaison for the Board in keeping the Chapter congregations informed of Diocesan issues.
 - Follow through with congregations facing financial difficulties as reflected through falling behind in their stewardship share.
