

From Bishop Monnot: An Invitation to a Holy Lent







Reminders for Congregational Leaders:

After your annual meeting: send the diocesan office your updated leadership (vestry, wardens, etc.)

Parochial Reports due March 1: fill out online here

- new this year: reporting of online worship participation is required
- Check out <u>The Episcopal Church Register App</u>. This online system that can be accessed from any device is fully integrated into the Parochial Report filing system. That means that if you use it to track your service attendance each week, when you get to the end of the year all the information on how many services you held and what your attendance was will already be in the filing system.
