Dismantling Racism


Becoming Beloved Community

Grounded in The Episcopal Church's commitment to dismantling racism as essential to our formation as Christians, this ONLINE training is open to all persons who would like to deepen their understanding of racism, prejudice, and privilege.

This training is required of all lay and ordained leaders in The Episcopal Church (including vestries, search committees, diocesan leadership, etc.). The training will consist of 2 sessions from 10:00am-12:00pm and 12:30pm-2:30pm.

The Rev. Charles Graves IV, an Executive Council member from the Diocese of Texas, proposed a resolution related to teaching Black history.

The resolution expressed "profound concern with attempts by school boards, local, state, and federal officials in the United States to curtail, limit, or

hinder the teaching of Black History or African American History in any form." It calls on Episcopal dioceses, congregations and other entities to be advocates against public policies that place such restrictions on education in their communities.

The proposal comes as Episcopal leaders express concern about the actions of some state leaders, most notably Florida Gov. Ron DeSantis, who are threatening to curb implementation of a newly released AP African American Studies curriculum over conservative perceptions of radical content included in some of the materials.

The fee for this event is \$35. Scholarships are always available and you can fill out the request form **HERE**.



2022 Recipient Spotlight:



ThreeHouse Campus Ministry: The Listening Post, with St. Luke's, Cedar Falls -- \$5,000

Through campus and community conversations and in collaboration with UNI's Counseling Center, they have identified an increasing need for providing safe and welcoming listening spaces in which people can share their experiences of isolation, transitions, discernment, struggles, and joys. They believe a way to meet this need is through a project called The Listening Post: a regular and consistent space on campus staffed by trained volunteers from collaborative churches who will engage in active listening, offer compassion, and provide resources on campus and in the community for individuals to connect with. Grant funds will be used for volunteer trainings, supplies, print resources, and marketing materials.




Simpson Youth Academy Scholarships, in partnership with Rev. Eric Rucker -- \$5,000

The Simpson College Youth Academy is a year-long, ecumenical program for Iowan high school youth grounded in the conviction that young people have gifts and power that are essential for the healing of the world now. Through college-level intellectual engagement, training in worship and prayer leadership, and reflective service around community issues, we help youth step into mature young adult Christian faith as they discern their particular callings as agents of justice in their churches and the world. Grant funds will be used to provide 4 tuition scholarships for Episcopal youth, LGBTQ+ youth, and/or youth whose racial or economic status inhibit their ability to pay tuition for the program's summer residency.


